

### Killingbeck Cemetery: Health and Safety Notice

Under health and safety legislation the diocese of Leeds has an obligation to ensure the safety of all visitors to Killingbeck cemetery. As a consequence an ongoing programme of testing of the stability of all grave memorials within Killingbeck cemetery is to commence. Any memorial found to be unsafe will be laid down. Photographic or video records will be kept of those monuments deemed unsafe and laid down. If you should find the grave you are visiting has been treated in this way, you are advised to

contact a qualified monumental mason, to have the memorial re-erected using a British standard approved fixing system. You may wish to have the memorial independently tested, if so, again you are advised to contact a monumental mason of your choice to undertake this testing. Please supply the cemetery office with a copy of the report.

National Eucharistic Congress 2018: As referred to in Bishop Marcus' Pastoral Letter this weekend, next year a National Eucharistic Congress will be held in Liverpool from Friday 7th to Sunday 9th September 2018; it is being organised under the mandate of the Catholic Bishop's Conference of England and Wales. Our representatives on the national organising committee are Fr Peter Kravos and Fr Sean Crawley; they will be sending out more updates in due course about the Congress and the associated local events which will be organised within the Diocese of Leeds.
