Make way for another university community in Leeds – Leeds Trinity University College.

The University College, previously known as Leeds Trinity & All Saints, began the new academic year with a new title after being granted the power to award its own degrees.

The new powers, granted by the Privy Council, mean that Leeds Trinity can design and approve its own courses and award Leeds Trinity University College degrees to its students.

Currently the University of Leeds awards degrees to graduates of Leeds Trinity, under an accreditation agreement with the university.

39 years after graduating with a Bachelor of Education degree, Gervase Phinn has collected a second honour from his alma mater, Leeds Trinity University College.

Leeds Trinity awarded Honorary Life Fellowships to the popular writer and broadcaster, as well as to Leeds West MP John Battle, to mark its inauguration as a University College.

Work is underway at Leeds Trinity University College that will see its Horsforth campus transformed by September 2010.

The building developments will help to create a vibrant sustainable campus village ensuring a great student experience for those coming to study in this new university community.

Already taking shape is a new student residence on the site of two 1960s halls of residence that were demolished during the summer. The new residence will offer students a modern living experience, with 198 ensuite bedrooms with self-catering facilities.

The new building will be a striking focal point at the heart of the campus, and is to be named All Saints Court. The name commemorates the institution's original foundation as Trinity and All Saints Colleges and ensures the continuation of the name All Saints as Leeds Trinity University College comes into being.

On behalf of the Higher Education Statistics Agency (HESA), the Careers Service contacts recent graduates each year for an update on their careers.

The resulting national Destinations of Leavers from Higher Education (DLHE) Survey gives a snapshot of what graduates are doing six months after graduation. The survey shows that despite the challenges of the economic climate 93% of those graduating in 2008 with a first degree from Leeds Trinity were either in work or further study.
