

## How Progression Rules Work for 3 year BA/BSc programmes Entry Prior to 2011/12

There are 3 basic thresholds for progressing from one level of your programme to the next. These are set out in details in the academic regulations but are summarised below:

### Level 4 to Level 5

- 1 To progress from Level 4 to Level 5 you must have attempted all assessments and obtained a minimum of 100 credits at Level 4 or above.

(Credits are assigned to modules. Modules are normally worth 20 credit points although sometimes they may have different credit point values such as 10 credits or 40 credits. You should refer to the Module Descriptors of your Programme of Study to see the specific value of each of your modules.)

To attain credits you need to pass the assessments associated with the module.

If you do not attempt all assessments the Exam Board will record a 'MUST re-sit and make a significant attempt' or MUST re-sit and pass' (if a progression module) before you can progress.

### Level 5 to Level 6

- 2 To progress from Level 5 to Level 6 you must have obtained a minimum of 100 credit points at Level 5 or above.

### At each Level

- 3 In addition, at each level, you must also satisfy at each stage any additional progression requirements of your particular Programme of Study.

These requirements will be detailed in the programme Specification (see the Programme of Study Catalogue on the web <http://www.leedstrinity.ac.uk/services/registryservices/Pages/default.aspx> and in the handbook provided by your department. For example in many programmes of study you will have to pass your professional placement module, or equivalent, in order to progress.

If you are in any doubt about the progression rules that apply to your Programme of Study you should speak to your Progress tutor.
